

MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT JUSTICE

Quick Look for Young Voters



95% of all cases begin (or end) with the Magistrate. When selecting a Magisterial District Justice think about the person you would want to help you if you found yourself in front of them.

What does a Magistrate do?

The magistrate settles minor disputes and determines which serious criminal cases should go to the Court of Common Pleas.

- Truancy and other Citations
- Arraignments, bail, issues warrants for misdemeanors and summary (minor) criminal matters (disorderly conduct, under age drinking, petty theft, etc)
- Certain traffic violations (Driving without a license, expired registration)
- Civil cases (like landlord/tenant) and other small claims (under \$12,000)
