The PA Constitution, as amended January 1, 1969, provides for a unified judicial system. The **Supreme, Superior, and Commonwealth Courts** are the state appellate courts. The **Courts of Common Pleas** are the county-level trial courts. Learn more at www.pacourts.us

Judicial Elections in Pennsylvania

- Judges in the courts of common pleas and state appellate courts are elected for 10-year terms.
- Judicial candidates are nominated in municipal primary elections which occur in odd-numbered years.
- When running for a first term on a court, judges run in a partisan election.
- A judge who has completed a term of 10 years may qualify for a **retention election**. The candidate's name appears on the ballot in November *without political party designation*. The voters indicate by voting "yes" or "no" whether that candidate shall be retained as a judge for an additional 10-year term.
- In the event of a vacancy, the Governor appoints and the PA Senate confirms a replacement.
- Pennsylvania judges must retire at age 75.

Supreme Court of Pennsylvania - 412-565-2816

The Pennsylvania Supreme Court hears appeals of decisions by the PA Superior and Commonwealth Courts. Like the US Supreme Court, the PA Supreme Court has discretion over which cases to take.

Allegheny County's Common Pleas Court has four divisions: Civil (Cv), Criminal (Cr), Family (F) and Orphans' (O) Courts. Civil Court handles most major civil cases, including contract disputes and business law. Criminal Division handles cases like assault, murder, and property theft. Family Court hears divorce, custody, domestic violence and juvenile cases. Orphans' Court handles issues like adoptions, guardianship and estate law.

Allegheny County has 46 magisterial districts. One Magisterial District Judge is elected in each district for a 6-year term. Elections are held in odd-numbered years. MDJs conduct preliminary arraignments and hear cases involving misdemeanors, small claims, setting bail, issuing warrants, and granting emergency Protection From Abuse orders. Some cases are referred to the Court of Common Pleas. MDJs also conduct marriage ceremonies.

Qualifications for Voters

- 1. You must be a citizen of the United States.
- 2. You must be at least 18 years of age on the day of the election.
- 3. You must be a resident of your Pennsylvania county and of your election district for 30 days.

Voter Registration

You can register

- online at vote.pa.gov
- on paper by requesting a Voter Registration Application from the Allegheny County Elections Division (412) 350-4500, at any public library, from the League of Women Voters Office (412)-261-4284, or download at wote.pa.gov. Mail completed form to the Allegheny County Elections Division, 542 Forbes Avenue, Suite 312, Pittsburgh, PA 15219
- in person at the Allegheny County Elections Division or at a voter registration drive.

If you move, you must update your address

- online at vote.pa.gov
- in person or by mail at the Allegheny County Elections Division (address above)
- by calling the County Elections Division at 412-350-4500 (for moves within Allegheny County)

Closed Primaries and Party Registration

Pennsylvania is a closed primary state. This means that your party registration affects when you may vote:

- In a **Primary Election**, only voters registered as members of the Democratic or Republican party may vote for *candidates*.
- Ballot Questions and Special Elections on the Primary ballot:
 All voters, whether registered in a party or not, may vote in
 the Primary when there is a ballot question, referendum, or
 special election on the ballot.
- In a **November (General) Election**, any registered voter may vote for any candidate of any political party.

Mail-in and Absentee Voting

- A mail-in ballot may be used by any registered voter for any reason.
- An **absentee ballot** may be used by registered voters who expect to be away from their municipality on election day due to college, work or vocation, or who are ill or incapacitated. (*This option remains because "absentee ballots" are quaranteed by the Pennsylvania State Constitution. However, the mail-in and absentee processes and ballots are the same.*)

There are three steps to receive and return a mail-in or absentee ballot:

- **1. Request Application:** Go to <u>vote.pa.gov</u> and complete the online mail-in or absentee ballot application. For a paper application, download, print, and mail the paper application. Or call 412-350-4500 to request a paper application.
- **2. Complete and Return Application:** Return paper mail-in or absentee ballot application to: Allegheny County Elections Division, 542 Forbes Avenue, Suite 312, Pittsburgh PA 15219. Online applications are automatically filed.
- **3. Complete and Return Mail-in Ballot:** When you receive your mail-in or absentee ballot, mark the ballot following the directions exactly. Be sure to *sign and date* the outer envelope. Voted mail-in or absentee ballots must be returned to your County Elections Division (*not your polling place*) and *received by 8 pm on Election Day*.

Voters' Guides

Know your candidates at election time. The LWVPGH provides these services.

- Online: Go to Vote411.org to get nonpartisan information about the candidates on your own ballot.
- **Print:** The Voters' Guide is compiled by the LWVPGH and published in **The New Pittsburgh Courier** newspaper on Wednesday, two weeks prior to each Primary and General Election. Copies can be found in local public libraries. A PDF copy of the printed Voters' Guide will be available online at www.lwvpgh.org.

Know Your Rights

- The first time you vote, or if you have moved, or the first time in a new polling place, you will need an approved photo or non-photo ID that shows your name and address. See the complete list of approved IDs in this "Make a Plan to Vote" graphic or at vote.pa.gov.
- If you registered to vote on time, but by Election Day have not received your ID card and have not been able to
 verify that your status is "active", you still have the right to go to your polling place to vote! Just ask for a
 provisional ballot. Do not leave without voting!
- If your name was NOT found in the Voting Record ("Voter Roll") or in the "supplemental" list in the back of the
 Voting Record, ask for a provisional ballot. Complete the form, sign your "declaration", and get a receipt to check
 later at vote.pa.gov. Do not leave without voting!
- If you make a mistake on your ballot, ask for a new one. If you are still in line at 8pm, stay in line until you are able to vote, no matter how late, even if they announce, "The poll is closed." Remember: You have the right to vote.
- Citizens with criminal records who are not currently incarcerated for a felony are eligible to vote. Learn more here.

Tips for Contacting Your Elected Officials

- Identify yourself as a constituent and give your address.
- Be polite and brief.
- State your position on the subject clearly. Refer to the name or number of a bill, if applicable.
- Request action.

Sample Script: "Hello. This is Jane Doe, and I live in your district at (your address). I am calling/writing to urge you to support/oppose/cosponsor (describe issue or name bill). This is important to me because, (your reason). I (do/do not) need a response. Thank you for considering my views."
